

**IN THE REGISTRIES OF PATENTS, TRADE MARKS, DESIGNS, PLANT VARIETIES AND
GEOGRAPHICAL INDICATIONS
INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY OFFICE OF SINGAPORE**

INTRODUCTION

1. As part of a government-wide initiative and in line with Singapore's ongoing Smart Nation efforts to leverage new technologies, IPOS Digital Hub will be migrating to the Government on Commercial Cloud platform from 1 to 13 May 2024. During this period, IPOS Digital Hub and IPOS Go mobile app will not be available.
2. To facilitate the migration, this period has been specified as excluded days. Deadlines falling during this period will therefore be extended to 14 May 2024.
3. At the same time, to minimise disruption, certain transactions can still be carried out through alternative filing modes. For these transactions, 2 to 4 May, 6 to 11 May and 13 May 2024 are not excluded days. As an illustration, a party filing a trade mark can still secure a filing date on these dates.
4. While we are allowing these transactions to continue, to protect applicants, any time limit for claiming of priority which fall within the excluded days and which is missed will still be extended up to 14 May 2024.
5. The details regarding the above are set out in the Practice Direction below.

REGISTRIES PRACTICE DIRECTION NO. 1 OF 2024

EXCLUDED DAYS

- I. **Excluded days from 1 to 13 May 2024 for all business except the business described in Section II**
6. Pursuant to the relevant provisions of the IP Acts,¹ the Registrar issues this Practice Direction to specify that 1 to 13 May 2024 (both dates inclusive) are excluded days for all business under the IP Acts and Rules,² except for the business described in Section II (defined as “the Transactable Business” for the purpose of this Practice Direction).

¹ The relevant provisions of the IP Acts are: section 111 of the Patents Act 1994, section 78 of the Trade Marks Act 1998, section 64 of the Registered Designs Act 2000, section 51 of the Plant Varieties Protection Act 2004 and section 35 of the Geographical Indications Act 2014.

² IP Acts and Rules refer to the Patents Act 1994 and Rules, the Trade Marks Act 1998 and Rules, the Registered Designs Act 2000 and Rules, the Plant Varieties Protection Act 2004 and Rules, and the Geographical Indications Act 2014 and Rules 2019.



II. Non-excluded days for Transactable Business

7. For the Transactable Business as tabulated in paragraph 8 below, 2 to 4 May, 6 to 11 May and 13 May 2024 are not excluded days.³

9. The Transactable Business includes applications for trade marks, patents, designs and plant varieties (see S/N 1-5 of the table), which may contain declarations of priority. For an application that contains a declaration of priority, with a time limit to claim priority that expires during the period of 1 to 13 May 2024 (“priority deadline”):

- a. Where the application is made on or before the priority deadline, it will be accorded a date of filing in accordance with paragraphs 11 and 12 below.

³ 1 May, being a public holiday; and 5 May and 12 May being Sundays, remain excluded days for all business, whether Transactable Business or otherwise.



- b. Where the application is not made by its priority deadline, that day – being the day on which the priority deadline expires – shall then be considered an excluded day for the application. This means that the day of the priority deadline is extended to 14 May 2024. However, should such application be subsequently filed on any day before 14 May 2024, the date of filing will still be given in accordance with paragraphs 11 and 12.⁴
10. For the Transactable Business that is filed on the non-excluded days, please use the alternative filing mode(s) as follows:
- a. Items S/N 1 to 12: Please submit the forms and requests via FormSG (<https://go.gov.sg/alternativefilingmode>).
 - b. Item S/N 13: Please submit your documents via email to ipos_hmd@ipos.gov.sg.

III. Effects

Date of Filing Accorded to Transactable Business

- 11. Transactable Business submitted through the relevant alternative filing mode on 2 to 4 May, 6 to 11 May and 13 May 2024 will be accorded a date of filing of that date when the Transactable Business is filed insofar as the applicable requirements are met.
- 12. Transactable Business submitted through the relevant alternative filing mode on 1, 5 and 12 May 2024 will be accorded a date of filing of the next following day insofar as the applicable requirements are met.⁵

Expiry of Time Periods

- 13. If the last day of a time period or limit as prescribed in the IP Acts and Rules falls on any of the excluded days from 1 to 13 May 2024, it will be extended to the next following day which is not an excluded day, i.e., 14 May 2024. Examples of such time periods or limits include the following, which are non-exhaustive:
 - a. Responding to deficiency letters or examination reports.
 - b. Renewing a patent, trademark, registered design, plant variety protection or geographical indication.
 - c. Submitting requests for continued processing or reinstatement.
 - d. Filing notices of oppositions or requests for extension of time to file a notice of opposition.

⁴ To illustrate:

- a. Where the time limit for claiming of priority expires on 6 May 2024, and the application is not filed by 6 May 2024, the time limit for claiming of priority is extended to 14 May 2024.
- b. Should this application be filed on 8 May 2024, the application will be taken to have been done on 8 May 2024.

⁵ World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO)'s online portal for filing and managing patent applications, ePCT, remains available for transacting with Singapore as the receiving Office. The date of filing for international patent applications filed via ePCT could be accorded on the day when the application is lodged insofar as the applicable requirements, as prescribed by WIPO are met.



IV. Registries Practice Direction No. 1 of 2023

14. This Practice Direction is effective only for the period of 1 to 13 May 2024 (both dates inclusive). For all other periods, Registries Practice Direction No. 1 of 2023 continues to apply in full force.⁶

⁶ Registries Practice Direction No. 1 of 2023 (on hours of business and excluded days) specify that i) all Saturdays shall be treated as excluded days for any business under the IP Acts and Rules, where the time for doing the business expires on that date and where the business was not done on that date, and ii) all Sundays and public holidays shall be excluded for all purposes under the IP Acts and Rules.
